EYES TOWARDS THE FUTURE: NEW COMPREHENSIVE CAMPAIGN

We are thrilled to launch the Caroga Arts Comprehensive Campaign under the guidance of Innovative Resources, a Saratoga Springs-based national development firm. The Reimagining the Adirondack Experience Through the Power of the Arts Campaign is a transformative initiative aimed at expanding and enriching the cultural and artistic offerings in the southern Adirondacks. Building on the incredible momentum from our previous capital campaign, this effort represents the next step in realizing our vision for Caroga Arts as a year-round hub for performances, education, and community engagement.

At the heart of this campaign is the development of two iconic spaces: the Sherman's Amphitheater and the Myhil Artist Residency Lodge. Sherman's Park, with its rich history dating back to the 1920s, will be enriched by a state-of-the-art amphitheater overlooking the lake, offering a breathtaking venue for outdoor concerts, performances, and community events. Meanwhile, the Myhil property will serve as a creative retreat for resident artists, with plans to construct a lodge, classrooms, and cabins designed to support artistic collaborations and immersive learning experiences. These projects will not only preserve the cultural heritage of our region but also create new opportunities for artists and audiences to connect in meaningful ways.

Thanks to the overwhelming support of our community, we've already raised significant funds toward these projects, including generous contributions from local, national, and international donors. We've also secured competitive grants from the New York State Council on the Arts, further demonstrating the importance of our vision for the region's cultural and economic growth. However, much work remains to be done. Over the next two years, we aim to raise an additional \$6.3 million to fully realize this vision and establish Caroga Arts as a lasting center for artistic excellence and education.

As we move forward, we invite all who are passionate about the arts, the future of the Adirondacks, and the power of music and culture to enrich our lives and communities to join us on this journey. Thank you for your ongoing support, and we look forward to what lies ahead!

The initiative was announced in the Fall of 2023 with programming beginning in January 2024 at Johnstown High School and Wheelerville Union Free School. The program expanded later in the semester to include Knox Middle School.

This summer, our program continued to grow, attracting over 40 participants of all ages who registered for a variety of offerings. These included the S.P.A.C.E. Camp for All Musicians, the S.P.A.C.E.
