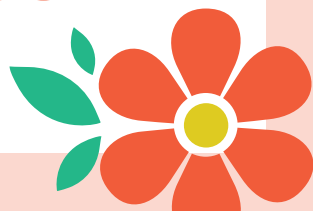


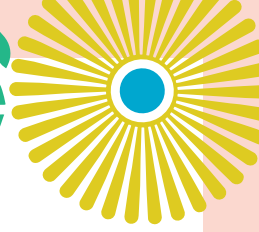
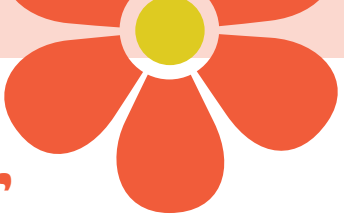
The sounds of a generation come alive as Caroga Arts welcomes you to *A Night with the Beatles!*

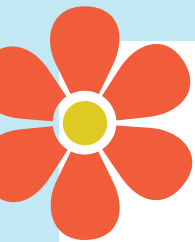

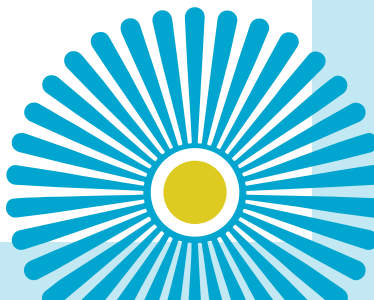

transformation. With unwavering leadership and thoughtful stewardship, Rick has been a champion of the organization during its most pivotal moments.

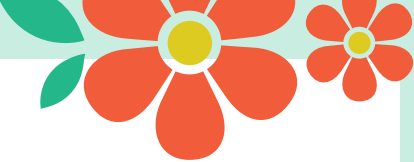
